

**Avoid the Rush:  
Sign Up Now to Verify 680s Online with Florida SHOTS**

Schools that sign up **now** to use the Florida SHOTS™ (State Health Online Tracking System) electronic signature certified Form 680 can beat the enrollment rush for the 2008-09 school registration season.

Administrative Rule 64D-3.046, F.A.C., allows schools and licensed child-care providers to accept electronically certified D.H. Form 680s as proof of immunization. The electronic signature certified Form 680 is available and accessible to any school or licensed child-care center that is enrolled in Florida SHOTS, the free statewide online immunization registry.

“Shot records in the registry are growing by leaps and bounds. Thousands of doctors are participating throughout Florida. Millions of children with more than 70 million vaccination records are in the registry. More than 400 schools have applied for access to Florida SHOTS, and there is sure to be an increased demand as schools begin registering students for the 2008-09 school year,” said Susan Lincicome, director, Florida SHOTS. “We encourage schools to sign up now so that our staff can approve their access in time for the school registration rush.”

Once a certified 680 is created by a participating health-care provider, the historic record is kept in Florida SHOTS, containing all the regular shot record information as well as a unique certification ID. Users may search for records by patient and print the most current immunization record, created by any authorized Florida SHOTS participant, without needing to contact doctors’ offices or parents for missing records.

Since the system is web-based, there is no software or hardware to install and all users receive free enrollment, training, usage and help-desk calls.
